Sterile Eye Wash Solution 895300 (Sodium Chloride 0.9%w/v)

Definition

Sterile eye wash is a sterile, isotonic, preservative- free solution containing Sodium chloride 0.9%w/v in water for injections.

Potential Health effects

Ingestion: Large doses may cause gastro intestinal upset. Overdose may cause fluid overload and electrolyte disturbances.

Skin contact: No adverse effect expected.

Eye contact: No adverse effect expected.

First aid measure

Ingestion: Not expected to require first aid measures. If large amounts were swallowed, give water to drink and get medical advice.

Skin contact: Wash exposed area with Soap and water. Get medical advice if irritation develops.
